Rare Plant Status Review:

Hesperevax sparsiflora var. brevifolia

Changes made since the original status review appear in blue.

Hesperevax sparsiflora var. brevifolia is an annual herb in the Asteraceae. In California, H. sparsiflora var. brevifolia occurs in sandy areas within coastal bluff scrub and coastal dune habitat from 0 to 215 meters in elevation.

*H. sparsiflora* var. *brevifolia* is currently on CNPS List 2.2 (Plants rare, threatened or endangered in California, but more common elsewhere). *H. sparsiflora* var. *brevifolia* is known from 29 occurrences along the northern California coast from San Mateo County north to Humboldt County, and in southern Oregon. *H. sparsiflora* var. *brevifolia* is globally ranked as T3 (Vulnerable) by NatureServe. Current evidence indicates that this taxon is also rare in Oregon. Sue Vrilakas (pers. comm. 2008) states that in Oregon, "besides the historic collections, we have 2 relatively recent reports (of *H. sparsiflora* var. *brevifolia*) from Coos (1997) and Curry (1995) counties." Based on this information we estimate that there are approximately 31 known occurrences of *H. sparsiflora* var. *brevifolia*.

In California, *H. sparsiflora* var. *brevifolia* is threatened by <del>logging</del>, development, non-native plants, foot traffic, and recreational activities, and is potentially threatened by trail construction. No information is available about the threats to this taxon in Oregon.

Based on the current understanding of the rarity of *H. sparsiflora* var. *brevifolia* within its entire range CNPS and CNDDB recommend that it be re-ranked from CNPS List 2.2 to List 1B.2.

Recommended Action

CNPS: Re-rank from CNPS List 2.2 to List 1B.2

CNDDB: Keep on CNDDB G4T2T3, S2S3
